Argaum celebrate moving to a new ground at Geasons, Plympton with a win

At Plympton, following a kick-off the Deputy-Mayor of Plymouth (Mr W.L. Bastard). Argaum pressed, and Hodge obtained possession to send Sully over for a try, which with a fine kick Robinson converted. Liskeard forwards were fast, and kept the game in the Argaum territory for some time. Argaum attacked strongly in the second half, but the Liskeard forwards took play the home half. Sully was instrumental in transferring play to the visitors' "25," and Perry scored, for Robinson to convert. A few minutes later Hodge sent Wilton over. Keeping up the pressure, Rowden scored, and Robinson landed a good goal.

The compliment was returned in 1956 when Liskeard-Looe reformed as a club after the war. Their first opposition was Plymouth Argaum, who returned once again in December 2006 as part of the club's 50th Anniversary celebrations. The two clubs also combined, along with Saltash, at Colts level in the 2011-12 season.
