LAST-MINUTE RALLY PENRYN JUST ESCAPE DEFEAT FROM ARGAUM

Penryn made their first home appearance with the opposition provided by Plymouth Argaum, the result being a draw of two tries (6 points) each.

Penryn were not at full strength, and the game was contested in a downpour of rain and a gale of wind. Argaum gave the Cornish side a hard game, and only a last-minute rally saved the homesters from defeat.

From the kick-off Argaum were in difficulties, but Vaughan relieved the pressure and play settled at the centre. Smart work on the part of the home half-backs (Richards and Medlin) again placed the visitors' line in danger, the ball going dead. Jago and Crossley in turn were prominent in holding up an attack by the visitors when Paul was almost through, and from a long kick by Sheppard, the home "outs" gained possession. Hopper touching down a try. The same player almost repeated the performance a moment later, but he was forced over at the corner.

Argaum equalized soon after the restart, Paul dodging over for a try following a scrum close to the line. At this stage Richards, the home scrum-half, who had twice previously been injured, had to be carried off the field, his absence proving a great handicap to the side. Cleverly put in a lengthy kick, which Crossley failed to gather, and by smartly following up Plucknett put Argaum ahead with a try. Penryn made a great effort to save the game, and gathering a loose ball Jago sent Medlin over with the equalizing try in the last minute.

Farewell C&D for Now...

Last week's defeat at Liskeard confirmed our relegation from the C&D league after a four year stint. It is actually our first demotion since 2000-01 when we dropped into Devon 3 so how do the situations compare? Back then we had an ageing team, no junior section and very little in terms of a development plan for the club. We now have a younger squad, a junior section, a club that is RFU accredited and incorporated. Coupled with ambitious plans off the pitch the future is bright for Argaum although we know it will be tough in Devon 1, a league we shot through on our way up to this level. It's been a privilege to watch the team play bigger clubs from across the region including illustrious opponents such as today's visitors, who arrive as league leaders. I think we have given a good account of ourselves on and off the field and made new friends along the way. All that remains after today's last home match is one final train trip to Cornwall, to take on Pirates next Saturday. Having had a taste of rugby at this level I'm sure we will back for another bite in the not too distant future.
