Chiefs 11 Topsham 18 - Devon Junior Vase Final – 05/04/14



The two teams met in the Devon Junior Vase Final attended by a large crowd at Bickleigh Down. The game was eagerly anticipated being Argaum's first county final for many years and with team about to clinch promotion from Devon Two. However a thick fog, which had enveloped Plymouth during the morning,

became so dense at times that only the players and the referee must have known exactly what was going on. Indeed the officials did get together during the second half to discuss abandoning the game, but they correctly, in most people's view decided to finish the game.

The Chiefs opened the scoring with a try from Kal Bloomfield but Topsham regrouped and clawed their way back into the game with a couple of penalties from prolific kicker Ricky Pellow and the Devon 1 side lead by a single point at half time. In the second period the visitors used the slope well and Sam Warren was the first to profit with a try converted by Pellow. Paul Ansell pulled 3 points back with a penalty for the Chiefs before Dominic Cant extended Tops lead with a try from a catch and drive. The Chiefs showed great character in the final quarter and roared on by the home crowd they exerted pressure resulting in a second penalty for Ansell, setting up a grandstand finish. Argaum couldn't quite maintain field position for long enough for the score which might have taken the game into extra time. Topsham were able to turn over the ball at crucial times and closed out the game. Although disappointed, many in the crowd agreed that The Chiefs had put up a very creditable performance against a side who could have quite easily gained promotion themselves from the division above.
